

All of the files needed for you to view the Arabic Characters should already be installed in Windows Vista. However, you will need to install the Arabic Keyboard Input so that you can type with the Arabic characters.

1) Click on **Start** button and then select **Control Panel**. 2) Under **Clock, Language, and Region** area, select **Change keyboards or other input methods** link. Note: If you are in the **Control Panel Classic View**, then double-click on **Regional and Language Options** icon and click on the tab **keyboard and languages**. 3) Click on the **Change keyboards...** button then click on **Add...** button. 4) Select the input language and keyboard.

Expand "**Arabic (Egypt)**" tree then Expand "Keyboard" tree from the list. Check **Keyboard Arabic (101)**

5) Click **OK** to add the selected keyboards to the Installed Services. 6) Click **OK** to confirm and apply your new language settings. 7) Open any Windows application then make sure the Language Bar menu on top is set to the input language you want.
