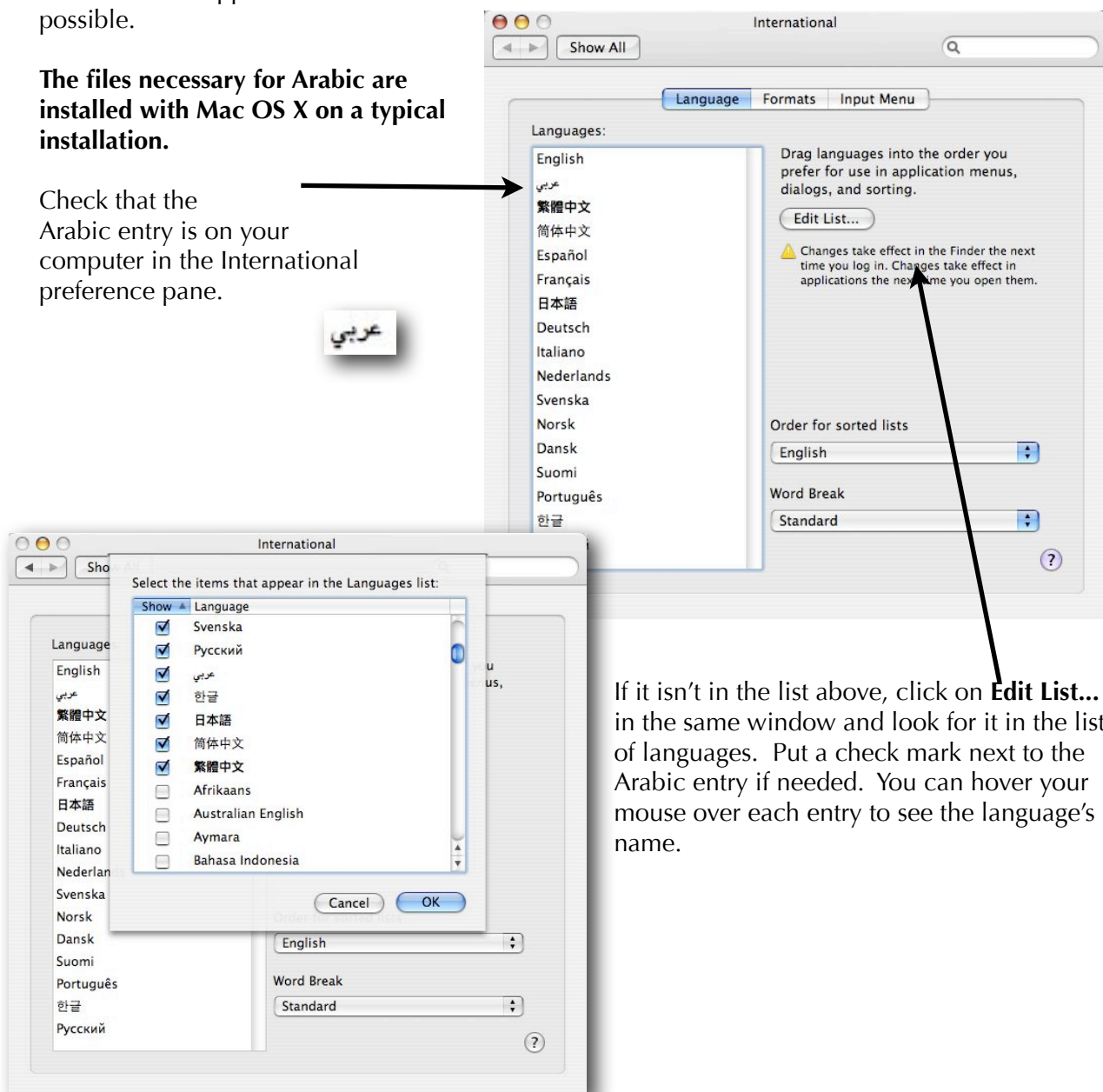
Installing Arabic Language Support - Mac OS X 10.4 (Tiger)

These instructions will help someone using Mac OS X Tiger add Arabic as an input language for their computer.

Under the Language tab in **System Preferences... International**, you will find a list of languages supported by OS X 10.4. The language at the top of the list is the default system language, used by the Finder and applications whenever possible.

The files necessary for Arabic are installed with Mac OS X on a typical installation.

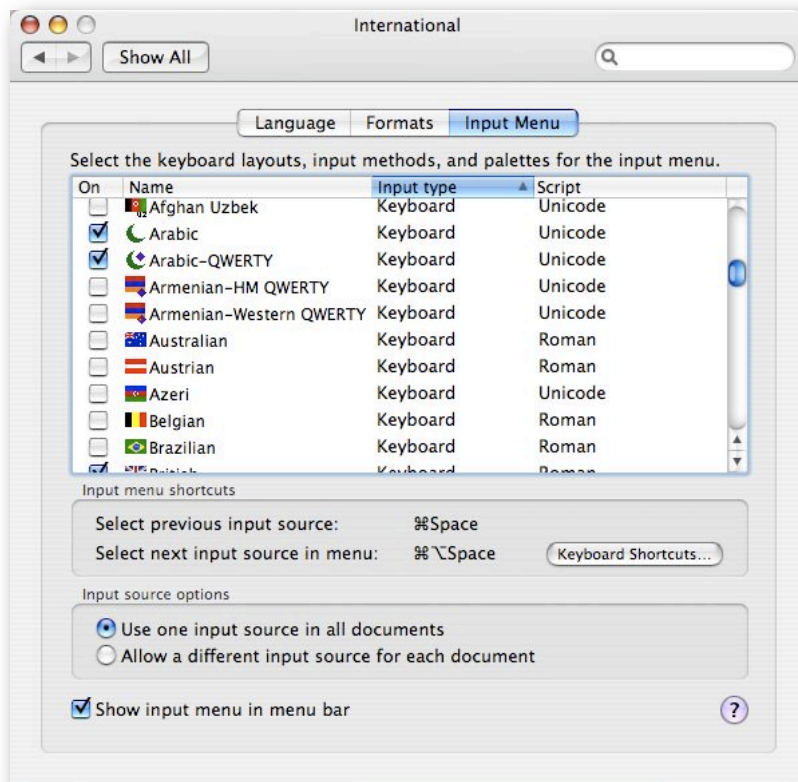
Check that the Arabic entry is on your computer in the International preference pane.



If it isn't in the list above, click on **Edit List...** in the same window and look for it in the list of languages. Put a check mark next to the Arabic entry if needed. You can hover your mouse over each entry to see the language's name.

Input Menu

Under the **Input Menu** tab in System Preferences... International, you will find check boxes that activate the components of the **Arabic** input method: **Arabic** and **Arabic-QWERTY**. Make sure that the **"Show input menu in menu bar"** box is also checked. You can also check the Character Palette box to make it appear.



The Arabic input methods and plug-ins you choose will appear right away in the Input menu itself, which appears on the right side of the Menu bar.

To activate a keyboard or input method, choose it from the menu. Its icon will appear in the Menu bar and it will have a check mark beside it in the menu.
